Panama's Master Plan for Sustainable Tourism Development uses the Tourism-Conservation-Research approach as the strategic framework for Panamanian tourism, and implements the Heritage Routes: a network of circuits that reflect the essence of Panama's natural and cultural heritage and become a key differentiating element for the destination.

Bridge of the World

Geological and historical interpretation of Panama as a land bridge. This route presents the impact of the emergence of Panama more than 3 million years ago, then crossing its colonial roads where wealth circulated for centuries, then offering the experience and history of the first inter-oceanic railroad in the world, until arriving at the Panama Canal with all its history that reaches to the present day.

Discover why we say that Panama is the isthmus that transformed the entire world.

Visit the Biomuseo and discover the history of the emergence of the Isthmus of Panama.

Tour the San Lorenzo Fort, the colonial fort that protected the interoceanic route.

Board the Panama Railroad and cross from the Caribbean to the Pacific.

And finally be amazed by the Panama Canal at the Miraflores visitor center.

Everywhere you look, Panama is the bridge to the world.

Birds in Paradise

Panama is home to unique species, and this bridge of biodiversity is the ideal place for birdwatching for experts and beginners. In our country 1018 species of birds have been reported, which exceeds the combined list of the United States and Canada.

Enjoy the diversity of Panama's bird life.

Climb Cerro Ancon and be amazed by the extraordinary migration of raptors.

Visit El Copé and discover a hummingbird with resplendent plumage.

Walk through the cloud forests of Boquete and find a resplendent quetzal.

And venture into the remote Darien plug and spot a harpy eagle with its chick.

From end to end, Panama is a bird paradise.



Ocean Wonders

The ecosystemic characteristics of Panama's oceans allow the development of 4 heritage circuits in the different regions of the country. These circuits include communities that understand the importance of the conservation of marine ecosystems, their species and the integration of their good practices with sustainable tourism.

Sail through the Pearl Archipelago and greet a humpback whale.


Dive Coiba Island and explore a vast coral reef.

In Panama, the sea is never far away.












Colon







Guna Yala is a Caribbean paradise of sun and sea. It is said that there is an island here for every day of the year, all surrounded by transparent waters populated by starfish, fish and coral. Guna Yala is also the largest territory of the ancestral Guna people. Its speedboats and sailboats communicate each of its island communities, where life is measured to the rhythm of the sea breeze and where the craftswomen make the famous molas: the unique pieces of Guna textile art.






